  - **8.1 Babergh DC** (Planning Dept) Re: *30 Collimer Close*. Resident had complained to Babergh and to the Clerk (verbal) regarding a business being conducted at the premises. Babergh considers that the business does not require planning permission at this time. An advertising banner did constitute a breach of planning control and had subsequently been removed. Clerk had advised the resident that if there were further concerns the resident/s should contact Babergh.
  - **8.2 Babergh DC** (Planning Dept) Re: *Suffolk House*. [notification e-mails via DCllr J Deacon]. An application had been sought by Babergh DC on a couple of occasions, which were not forthcoming, which in its own right was not sufficient to warrant further action and the file has been closed.

*Enforcement officer:* Planning enforcement works on the basis of a consideration of harm caused, e.g. significant loss of amenity or highway safety issues, and the power to take action is entirely discretionary. An application would be sought but if not forthcoming, they would consider whether it was expedient to commit resources for simply regulating the development.

**Infrastructure:** Broadband; Health facilities; Recycling Centre; Affordable Housing and Pre-school facilities were discussed and financial provision was thought to be inadequate.

**Highway Safety and Sustainable Travel:** *Real Time Passenger Information (RTPI)* at bus stops the £60,000 amount for the implementation of, was considered to be a total waste of money, as by the time the development was completed, people would be accessing this information via their phones, tablets or other new technology.

The Shotley Peninsula Community Path: (Cllr R Kirkup declared a personal interest, as she was involved in this project). The offer of £195,000 would not even cover the stage between Shotley Gate and Shotley Street.

The Chairman of the Shotley Peninsula Cycling Campaign (SPCC) had written a response to Babergh DC with a copy forwarded to the Parish Council.

*Improvement Schemes on the B1456:* **Chelmondiston** - £25,000 (to be confirmed) was allocated to be spent on traffic calming measures. Members strongly felt that the Parish Council wants to be consulted prior to any decision on implementation being made.

*Heritage:* Members considered that any cost involved in reinstating the Ceremonial Mast in proper order should be entirely separate from the s106 monies, as this is an obligation of the owner, regardless of whether the development goes ahead. s106 monies should also not be used for street naming.

The £2.5 million cost for heritage reinstatement amounts to approximately two thirds of the s106 budget. it was questionable whether this was a fair balance, as there were other priorities of equal importance.

It was still unclear whether Babergh had commissioned a professional independent assessment of the value of the whole development, in order to propose a fair mitigation 'pot' for all the communities affected
